No. 18 Group, Royal Observer Corps, Leeds

The original Leeds Group Headquarters (then No. 8) had its beginnings in Vicar Lane, Leeds, before being transferred to the General Post Office buildings in Leeds at the commencement of the War in 1939. In 1942 the Headquarters was moved to Grove House, Hyde Park, Leeds, where, except for a brief period of re-construction in 1942 it remained until the recent move to Yeadon.

In 1955 the Royal Observer Corps, with its network of Observation Posts covering the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland and manned entirely by spare time volunteers, was charged with the responsibility of reporting detailed information on any nuclear attack on this Country and of monitoring subsequent radio-active fall-out in the Home Office Warning and Monitoring Organisation.

This additional role has necessitated a complete rebuilding programme of both Observation Posts and Operations Rooms. The post personnel are now provided with underground accommodation which would enable them to operate under the severest conditions of radio activity and to be self-supporting for long periods. The new type operations room also has a very high protective factor, being air conditioned and provided with fully automatic stand-by electrical generating plant, dormitories, fully equipped kitchen and canteen with emergency rations including reserve water supply, capable of maintaining the general fitness of crews for considerable periods.

The instruments with which the Corps is now issued enables it, with a minimum of delay, to supply accurate information on the time, power, position and height of any nuclear explosion over any part of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland and also to provide accurate data on the degree of intensity and flow of radio-active fall-out. This information is passed to the Home Office Sector Operations Rooms where it is promulgated to the Air Defence Operations Centre of Fighter Command, Bomber Command Headquarters, Regional War Rooms and organisations within the NATO Alliance.
