ROYAL OBSERVER CORPS - POSTS

OFFICERS AND SUPERVISORY STAFF RESPONSIBILITIES

GROUP OFFICER

- 1. The Group Officer in war is:
 - a. Responsible to the Group Commandant for:
 - (1) Bringing the UKWMO Monitoring Posts allocated him to a state of full operational readiness, redeploying personnel as necessary.
 - (2) Attending at the place of duty designated by the Group Commandant.
 - (3) The provision of up-to-date information on administrative and logistic matters at UKWMO Monitoring Posts.
 - (4) The command of all ROC personnel on the strength of the Monitoring Posts allotted to him.
 - b. Responsible to the SDO for:
 - (1) The effective operational performance of the ROC personnel on the strength of the Monitoring Posts allotted to him; and
 - (2) Reporting failures of any kind which place limits upon the operational tasks which can be performed.
- 2. The Group Officer in Peace is responsible to the Group Commandant for:
 - a. The effective training of the Post personnel under his command.
 - b. The administration of Posts allotted to him and the administration and welfare of their personnel.
 - c. The supervision of the maintenance of the structure of the UKWMO Monitoring Posts allotted to him.

HEAD OBSERVER

- 3. The Head Observer in War is responsible to the Group Officer for:
 - a. Bringing his UKWMO Monitoring Post to a full state of operational readiness.
 - b. Preparing duty rosters for Nos 1, 2 and 3 Observers and his remaining personnel to ensure effective operations.
- 4. The Head Observer in Peace is responsible to the Group Officer for:
 - a. The operational efficiency and structural preparedness of his $\ensuremath{\mathsf{UKWMO}}$ Monitoring Post.
 - b. The training of his personnel by the Post Instructor.

c. The administration of his ROC Post and the administration and welfare of his personnel.

POST INSTRUCTOR

- 5. The Post Instructor is responsible to the Head Observer for:
 - a. The training of Post personnel to a high standard of operational efficiency.
 - b. The assumption of the Head Observer's responsibilities in his absence.
